I'm taking a small sketchbook, one pen and one pencil as I'll only have a small bag with me and I'm not sure if I'll have the time or opportunity to sit and draw, but I always like to have something with me just in case. If not, I will be taking many, many photos of anything I spot along the way, then I can have a good look through when I get back and use them as reference or collage material.
